WHABOUCHI MINING PROJECT: COMEX ANNOUNCES PUBLIC HEARINGS IN NEMASKA AND CHIBOUGAMAU

Québec City, February 16, 2015 – The Environmental and Social Impact Review Committee (COMEX) announces that it will hold two public hearing sessions on the Whabouchi mining project proposed by the proponent Nemaska Lithium Inc. The purpose of the hearings is to allow citizens to learn about the project, the environmental impact assessment and review procedure, as well as COMEX's role. It also enables COMEX to receive opinions and comments on the project and documents submitted by the proponent to the Administrator of section 22 of the James Bay and Northern Québec Agreement:

THE PROPONENT'S PROJECT PROPOSAL

"The Whabouchi project involves the development of a spodumene deposit. The mined spodumene will be sent to a processing plant where the lithium will be extracted. The projected lifespan of the project is 28 years. Once the mine is in operation, there will be 125 workers on the site. The project will involve the mining of spodumene from an open pit 1300 m long, 300 m wide and 190 m deep. The extraction rate will be 3,000 tonnes of ore and 8,600 tonnes of waste rock per day. The project will use conventional open-pit mining methods: drilling, blasting and transport of ore to a crusher at the surface."
