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**1) CALL TO ORDER AND ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA**

The agenda was adopted as presented.

**2) ADOPTION OF THE MINUTES OF THE 322ND MEETING**

The following changes were made to the minutes (see underlining):

- p. 3: #20141001-02: that the proponent must submit an update of its project before proceeding any further with the review process, except for condition 16.
- p. 5, Item 8: WHEREAS the COMEX members would like the proponent to respond to the following questions/comments.
- p. 7 #20141001-04: to recommend that the Administrator forward the above 15 questions/comments to the proponent.
- P. 9, Item 11: a note to the effect that the COMEV directives require the proponent to consult the population;

**Action: File the minutes of the 322nd meeting**

**3) CORRESPONDENCE AND FOLLOW-UP ACTION (APPENDIX A)**

After the notice of the meeting had been sent, a response to the document on public participation was received from the Secrétariat aux affaires autochtones. Also, Hydro-Québec informed the Administrator that it has put its project to install a 161-kV transmission line for the Blackrock Metals project on hold.

**4) RENARD DIAMOND PROJECT**

- a) Request to amend the CA (third part)
  - *for discussion*

WHEREAS the proponent wants to use liquefied natural gas rather than fuel for power generation;

WHEREAS COMEX did not receive all of the documents and information needed to review the requested amendment to the certificate of authorization;

THEREFORE, the members agreed to defer this item to the next meeting.

**Action: Put this item on the agenda of the next meeting**

**5) ORPHAN MINE SITES AND ABANDONED EXPLORATION SITE**

- *for discussion*

WHEREAS in the context of the Stornoway mining project, the proponent wanted to conduct fish habitat compensation work on an abandoned mine site that is still contaminated;

WHEREAS the proponent learned of this site only recently;

WHEREAS the members think that a map showing the location of all orphan mine sites in the James Bay region would help understand the cumulative impacts and overall context of projects under review;

WHEREAS a verification revealed that the Ministère de l'Énergie et des Ressources naturelles (MERN) holds information on former mine sites only;

WHEREAS the Cree Nation Government has a preliminary inventory of abandoned mineral exploration sites;

THEREFORE, the COMEX members decided:

*#2014-1119-01: to write to MERN to obtain a map showing the location of abandoned mine sites;*

*#2014-1119-02: to verify the available information on abandoned mineral exploration sites with the Cree Nation Government.*

**Action: Write to MERN**

**6) ELEONORE MINING PROJECT**

- a) Final design of the tailings site – proponent's response

- *for recommendation*

WHEREAS condition 2.9 of the comprehensive certificate of authorization issued on November 10, 2011, requires the proponent to obtain approval of the final tailings site design;

WHEREAS COMEX received the final design on May 21, 2014, and additional information on September 25, 2014;

WHEREAS the members are satisfied with the information received;

THEREFORE, the COMEX members decided:

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*#2014-1119-03: to recommend that the Administrator approve the final design of the Eleonore mine tailings site.*

**Action: Write to the Administrator**

- b) Annual environmental follow-up and monitoring report for 2013
  - *for recommendation*

WHEREAS the comprehensive certificate of authorization issued on November 10, 2011, requires the proponent to implement an environmental follow-up program;

WHEREAS COMEX received, for information, the annual environmental follow-up and monitoring report for 2013 on September 2, 2014;

WHEREAS the proponent wishes to modify the follow-up program for lake sturgeon, in particular by abandoning telemetric monitoring;

WHEREAS individuals tagged by the proponent are likely to provide information on changes in the migration pattern of lake sturgeon, possibly due to the mine's operation;

THEREFORE, the COMEX members decided:

*#2014-1119-04: to inform the Administrator that the 2013 environmental follow-up and monitoring report for the Eleonore mine is acceptable.*

*#2014-1119-05: to recommend that the Administrator put the following questions to the proponent before authorizing the proposed changes to the environmental follow-up program for lake sturgeon:*

**Question 1:** *Can the stationary acoustic monitoring system be installed in an alternative site (with lower water depths) where it would be possible to detect the 31 fish tagged by Opinaca Mines? Also, since the project was supposed to be jointly conducted with Hydro-Québec, could a Hydro-Québec-owned device not be used to detect the 31 sturgeon elsewhere in the reservoir or in rivers of the Opinaca-Eastmain system?*

**Question 2:** *The proposed program included supplementary monitoring to the stationary acoustic system, stated as follows: [Translation] Furthermore, tallymen in the area will be provided with a portable detection device so they can detect transmitters implanted in sturgeon they catch when fishing. The proponent must report on the progress of this follow-up.*

**Question 3:** *The objective of conducting follow-up activities jointly with Hydro-Québec was explained as follows: [Translation] The collected data will be used to create a database in partnership with Hydro-Québec. Each time a tagged sturgeon is caught or movement is recorded, this information will be entered in the database. In addition, all other bodies conducting studies in the reservoir where sturgeon will be tagged and/or fitted with a transmitter will be invited to enter the results in the*

database. It will thus be possible to track the migration pattern of sturgeon in the Opinaca reservoir and identify any changes in this regard. Creation of the database will greatly facilitate the circulation of information among the different bodies and thereby considerably enhance knowledge about this species in the territory of Northern Québec. Pooling knowledge about lake sturgeon will benefit Hydro-Québec, current and future proponents as well as the Cree First Nation. *In addition, the proponent says that Hydro-Québec intends to continue telemetric monitoring in Eastmain River beyond 2016. The proponent must report on the progress of discussions and agreements with Hydro-Québec in this regard. Since Hydro-Québec will be continuing its telemetric monitoring program, which accounted for the majority of data collected (300 versus 31 individuals in Opinaca River) for the database proposed by Opinaca Mines in 2014, the proponent must provide greater justification for abandoning its telemetric monitoring without further discussion. Also, what about data that will be collected by other bodies conducting sturgeon-related activities in the reservoir?*

**Action: Write to the Administrator**

**7) BLACKROCK MINING PROJECT**

- a) Follow-up on condition 16
  - *for recommendation*

WHEREAS, on July 11, 2014, COMEX received information relating in particular to condition 16 of the certificate of authorization issued on December 6, 2013;

WHEREAS the COMEX members find that the information submitted by the proponent is incomplete;

WHEREAS a document containing 34 questions and comments was submitted to the members and the members are satisfied with said document;

THEREFORE, the COMEX members decided:

*#2014-1119-06: to recommend that the Administrator send the document containing the questions and comments to the proponent before determining if condition 16 of the certificate of authorization has been met.*

**8) PROPOSED CONSTRUCTION OF A 161-KV POWER TRANSMISSION LINE BY HYDRO-QUÉBEC FOR THE BLACKROCK MINING PROJECT**

- a) Condition 8
  - *for recommendation*

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WHEREAS COMEX received a document containing information to meet condition 8 of the certificate of authorization;

WHEREAS the COMEX members consider that the proponent has met condition 8 by explaining how it intends to inform land users of progress in the work and of any adjustments to the existing power line that may be necessary;

THEREFORE, the COMEX members decided:

*#2014-1119-07: to recommend that the Administrator acknowledge that the proponent has adequately satisfied condition 8 of the certificate of authorization.*

**Action: Write to the Administrator**

- b) *Notice of suspension of project*
  - *for information*

WHEREAS COMEX was informed that the proponent is putting the project on hold due to the change in construction schedule for the BlackRock mining project;

THEREFORE, the COMEX members take note of this information and will wait to hear from the Administrator as to the new power line commissioning date.

**9) Troilus mining project**

- a) Proponent's response to questions on the 2013 post-closure annual report
  - *for recommendation*

WHEREAS COMEX received, for information, the post-closure annual environmental monitoring and inspection report for the Troilus mining project as well as additional information on October 23, 2014;

WHEREAS the proponent mentioned that the results for water quality monitoring in pits in 2013 will be included in the 2014 annual report;

WHEREAS the members consider that the information received is complete and satisfactory;

THEREFORE, the COMEX members decided:

*#2014-1119-08: to inform the Administrator that the post-closure annual environmental monitoring and inspection report for 2013 is complete and that the results for water quality monitoring in pits in 2013 will be included in the 2014 annual report.*

**Action: Write to the Administrator**

**10) EASTMAIN-1-A/RUPERT PROJECT, HYDRO-QUÉBEC**

- a) Follow-up on special-status plant species in 2013 (final report)
  - *Request to cancel the final two years (2016 and 2020) of the follow-up program on special-status plant species: for recommendation*

WHEREAS COMEX received the final report on the follow-up of special-status plant species in 2013;

WHEREAS based on the results of the first two years of post-derivation follow-up, i.e. 2010 and 2013, the proponent is of the opinion that the abundance of species monitored should remain relatively high in relation to the baseline conditions established in 2009 and that the final two years of follow-up could be dropped;

WHEREAS the COMEX members read the follow-up report and, in light of the results, agreed that the final two years of follow-up of special-status plant species could be dropped;

THEREFORE, the COMEX members decided:

*#2014-1119-09: to recommend that the Administrator authorize cancellation of the final two years of the follow-up program for special-status plant species, i.e. 2016 and 2020, as requested by Hydro-Québec.*

**Action: Write to the Administrator**

- b) Maps of navigation corridors
  - *for information*

WHEREAS maps showing navigation corridors were sent to COMEX for information purposes;

WHEREAS the maps were sent to the representatives of the Cree communities concerned;

THEREFORE, the COMEX members think it would be worthwhile to send the maps to the communities concerned.

- c) Follow-up on navigation conditions in Rupert River – Consultation of Cree users – 2013  
*Request to defer the interviews planned for 2014 to 2018: for recommendation*

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WHEREAS COMEX received the 2013 report on consultation of Cree users regarding follow-up on navigation conditions in Rupert River;

WHEREAS the proponent wishes to defer the interviews with Cree users of Rupert River planned for 2014 to 2018;

WHEREAS this request was made further to a recommendation by the “navigation” subcommittee, whose members include Cree partners from Waskaganish and Nemaska, and whereas deferring the consultations will give users time to adjust to the new navigation conditions on Rupert River;

THEREFORE, the COMEX members consider that the proponent’s request is justified and thus decided:

*#2014-1119-10: to recommend that the Administrator grant Hydro-Québec’s request to defer the interviews to 2018.*

**Action: Write to the Administrator**

- d) Follow-up of fish populations in the increased-flow section of Eastmain River – Environmental monitoring during operation phase (2013)
  - *for discussion*

WHEREAS COMEX received, for information, the 2013 follow-up report on fish populations between KP 193 and KP 217 in the increased-flow section of Eastmain River;

WHEREAS the members note that the fish pass at KP 207 is effective for lake sturgeon and other species;

WHEREAS COMEX also received for information purposes the 2012-2013 follow-up report on anadromous cisco in Rupert River;

WHEREAS the members note that the issues with cisco are related more to fishing than to species abundance;

THEREFORE, the COMEX members find the information sent by the proponent to be satisfactory and think that the 2014 follow-up report will be a key factor in the decision to continue follow-up or not.

**11) EXTENSION OF ROUTE 167 NORTH (MTQ)**

- a) Decommissioning and restoration plan for sites affected by work on Segment A (km 0-82)
  - *for recommendation*

WHEREAS COMEX received the decommissioning and restoration plan for sites affected by construction of Segment A of the Route 167 extension;

WHEREAS COMEX sent the Administrator a recommendation regarding the decommissioning and restoration plan for sites affected by construction of Segment B of the Route 167 extension and whereas it would be advisable for the proponent to harmonize work on the various lots to ensure optimal decommissioning and restoration of sites affected by the road's construction;

WHEREAS, unlike Segment B, part of Segment A crosses sensitive areas, including the territory covered by the proposed Albanel-Témiscamie-Otish national park;

WHEREAS the COMEX members think that the proponent must therefore give special attention to the territory covered by the proposed Albanel-Témiscamie-Otish national park during decommissioning and restoration of Segment A;

THEREFORE, the COMEX members decided:

*#2014-1119-11: to recommend that the Administrator authorize the decommissioning and restoration plan for Segment A on the following conditions:*

**Condition 1** *The proponent must restore the unauthorized sources of granular material at km 4 and km 70, as they are located within the boundaries of the proposed Albanel-Témiscamie-Otish national park. Restoration must meet the standards fixed for restoration of Segment B. In addition, restoration must be carried out respecting a minimum slope of 3:1 and planting tree and plant species previously authorized for this sector by the Ministère des Forêts, de la Faune et des Parcs.*

**Condition 2** *Most of the waste disposal sites identified by the proponent in Appendix G of its document are located near water bodies, intermittent or permanent streams or wetlands, thereby creating a risk of contamination of these fragile ecosystems. A follow-up report of steps taken and developments to adequately protect ecosystems, including photographs, must be sent to the Administrator, for information, following completion of decommissioning and restoration work. The report may be sent as part of the environmental follow-up stipulated in the certificate of authorization issued under Chapter II of the Environment Quality Act.*

**Condition 3** *Certain sections of the old winter road that are used and for which the only work planned is scarifying and tree planting could lead to the entry of sediment into nearby sensitive areas. These erosion-prone areas must be adequately stabilized and planted. Once decommissioning and restoration has been completed, the proponent must promptly send the Administrator, for information, a report, including photos identifying sites on which work has been carried out, a description of the work carried out, and the effectiveness of the measures taken. The report may be sent as part of the environmental follow-up the proponent is required to carry out.*

**Condition 4** *The proponent mentions that Quarry 55-B and Sandpit D-R 167A will be kept as a future source of material for road maintenance. These sites must be gradually*

*redeveloped over time, according to a schedule determined with the Direction régionale de l'analyse et de l'expertise de l'Abitibi-Témiscamingue et du Nord-du-Québec of the MDDELCC.*

**Condition 5** *The proponent must restore the cliff at the northeast end of Disposal Site D22, such that the sites remain safe for future visitors to the Albanel-Témiscamie-Otish national park.*

**Condition 6** *The proponent must ensure that all encroachments, borrow pits and access roads to borrow pits within the boundaries of the Albanel-Témiscamie-Otish national park are closed, restored and revegetated, with the exception of part of Disposal Site D22B, as agreed upon with the Direction des parcs of the Ministère des Forêts, de la Faune et des Parcs and presented in Appendix E of the decommissioning and restoration plan.*

**Condition 7** *As mentioned in the decommissioning and restoration plan, access roads to borrow pits will be scarified and planted with trees to block access to them. As soon as the work has been completed, the proponent must send the Administrator, for information, a report on the work performed. The report must include photos and may be submitted as part of the environmental follow-up the proponent is required to carry out.*

**Condition 8** *The decommissioning and restoration plan indicates the main sites subject to Division IV.2.1 of the Environment Quality Act pertaining to land protection and rehabilitation in the event of contamination. The proponent must submit to the Direction régionale de l'analyse et de l'expertise de l'Abitibi-Témiscamingue et du Nord-du-Québec of MDDELCC, before the work is completed, a status report on all sites covered by Division IV.2.1 of the Environment Quality Act, as well as planned decontamination work. The report must also include contaminated sites not covered by Division IV.2.1 of the Environment Quality Act, including the contaminated soil stockpiles observed during the MDDELCC's field inspections. In addition, in the event that site decontamination is required, the proponent must submit an application to the Administrator in accordance with Chapter II of the Environment Quality Act.*

**Condition 9** *Work camps and other related facilities erected during the construction of the Route 167 North extension should eventually be dismantled. The proponent must send the Administrator, for information, a report on the decommissioning of these sites. In the event that some of the facilities are kept, they must be authorized by the MDDELCC and the proponent must indicate who will be responsible for them.*

## **12) UPDATING OF PUBLIC PARTICIPATION GUIDELINES**

### **a) Comments received**

WHEREAS COMEX received comments on the updating of its public participation guidelines;

WHEREAS the comments deal in particular with:

- clearer rules for hearings and consultations;
- the role of band council chiefs;

- community involvement in organizing public consultations;
- independence of the chair;
- time allotted to participants to speak at hearings;
- structure of discussions during public hearings;

THEREFORE, the COMEX members think these comments will be taken into account when updating the public participation guidelines.

b) Press release

A press release will be issued on November 20, at 1:00 p.m. announcing the holding of consultations on the updating of its public participation process.

**13) COMEX WEBSITE**

The website came on line on November 20, 2014. Certain sections are available in Cree. Others are forthcoming.
