Steps in the Procedure (Provincial and Cree)

- 1. Preliminary Information Statement: submitted to appropriate Administrator
- 2. Assessment and Directive (COMEV):
 The Evaluating Committee issues a
 directive for all projects that must
 undergo the process
- 3. **Preparation of the Impact Study** by the proponent and submission to the Administrator
- 4. Analysis by Review Committe
 (COMEX): All documents, including any
 Questions & Responses, are analyzed by
 various environmental experts (Québec
 Government and government of the
 Cree Nation), public hearings
 (importance of public participation),
 final analysis, recommandations are
 submitted to the Administrator
- 5. Decision by the Administrator: authorization or refusal
- Monitoring and control by the Administrator, COMEX, MELCC and GCN

Administrative framework of COMEX

- Committee established under section 22 of the JBNQA
- 5 members :
 - 3 members appointed by Québec
 - 2 members appointed by the Cree Nation Government (CNG)
- Protection of health and environment as well as economic and social well-being
- Independent body for the assessment and review of the social and environmental impacts of projects
- Monthly meetings
- Reviews supported by a team of analysts from the ministère de l'Environnement et de la Lutte contre les changements climatiques (MELCC) and the CNG
- Holding of public hearings, if necessary
- Mandate: Recommendations to provincial and regional administrators
 + environmental and social follow-ups

Guiding principles (Art. 22.2.4)

- a) The protection of the hunting, fishing and trapping rights of Native people in the Territory, and their other rights in Category I lands, with respect to developmental activity affecting the Territory
- b) The environmental and social protection regime with respect to minimizing the impacts on Native people by developmental activity affecting the Territory
- c) The **protection of Native people, societies, communities, economies**, with respect to developmental activity affecting the Territory
- d) The protection of wildlife resources, physical and biotic environment, and ecological systems in the Territory with respect to developmental activity affecting the Territory



Guiding principles (Art. 22.2.4)

- e) The **rights and guarantees of the Native people** within Category II established by and in accordance with **section 24** until such land is developed
- f) The **involvement of the Cree people** in the application of this regime
- g) The **rights and interests of non-Native people**, whatever they may be
- h) The **right to develop** by persons acting lawfully in the Territory
- i) The minimizing of negative environmental and social impacts of development on Native people and on Native communities by reasonable means with special reference to those measures proposed or recommended by the impact assessment and review procedure
